#### From Our Regional Pastor

Dear Friends,

We have some very positive news this month, and we are also looking for your feedback on the ritual changes we have been using in Sunday services.

In the positive news department, the Rev. Chris Bown has agreed to volunteer in the new position of "Congregational Coordinator" for Sower's Chapel, which means that he will be paid an honorarium for serving the membership with a variety of every-day tasks in and out of the office, to facilitate good communication and effective work by all the volunteers, contractors, and so on. He will check the mail and phone messages, update the website as needed, and be a resource for anyone who needs some help or guidance in getting things done at the church.

This is a new position, and Chris is taking it on a trial basis, subject to review by him and the pastor's council on a quarterly basis. His hours will be very flexible, including time off for his retirement activities, but on average we think he may be on duty up to 10 hours a week. Please feel free to chat with Chris about this, and if you have any concerns just let him or a member of the pastor's council know.

As for the new Sunday orders of service, I am pleased that all the visiting ministers have been willing to adopt these new formats, and I hope they are "working" for you. As mentioned last month, they were heartily endorsed by the pastor's council, but even so, we want your opinions about them in case further changes are useful.

And here's something to notice about them. The original "offices" in the Liturgy were all designed with the idea of focusing on humility and self-examination, looking to repentance as we enter into a state of worship. These orders are all focused on praise and thankfulness as the first "order of business" in worship, the idea being that the lessons and sermon that follow will introduce us to the more reflective states of humility, later in the service.

In addition, the use of short musical selections following the prayers is intended to appeal to our affections as we worship, and to provide more general participation than has

been the case in recent years. And it is worth noting that many of our members have come from a background that features this sort of ritual, so the hope is that this will provide a comfortable worship experience for them, while also encouraging an enhanced sphere of holiness in the services for all of us. (It's the same idea for the use of full ministerial robes, which the Council also encouraged.)

Finally, please note the long list of special summer events that will be coming up this year, including the big General Church Assembly, various church camps, retreats, young people's events, the annual charity golf scramble, and even our own Vacation Bible School. There's going to be something for everyone, so plan ahead, and don't miss out!
